DHS: FEE INCREASES FOR CERTAIN AMBULANCE TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

The Department of Human Services announced fee increases in the medical assistance program for certain ambulance transportation services in both the fee-for-service and managed care delivery systems for dates of service on and after January 1, 2019. More information about the increased fees can be viewed on the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*.

The fiscal impact of the fee increase for fiscal year 2018-2019 is \$3,672,000, with \$1,351,000 in state funds and \$2,321,000 in federal funds. The impact for fiscal year 2019-2020 is an annualized amount of \$5,753,000, with \$1,940,000 in state funds and \$3,813,000 in federal funds. Submit written comments regarding the revised ambulance transportation fees to the Department of Human Services, Office of Medical Assistance Programs, c/o Deputy Secretary's Office, Attention: Regulations Coordinator, Room 515, Health and Welfare Building, Harrisburg, PA 17120.


The Department of Transportation announced its intention to sell the following land owned by the Department:



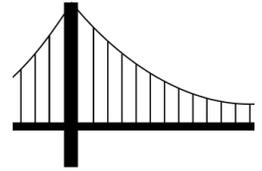

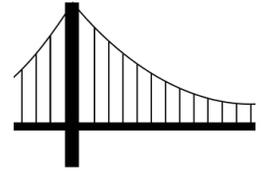
