1. Membership with the Pennsylvania Chapter is on a calendar (January 1 to December 31) basis.
2. Membership with the Chapter is separate from membership with ACPA/National. The collection of dues and assessments by the Chapter is separate from dues or assessments collected by ACPA/NATIONAL. Cement companies wishing to be a member of ACPA/NATIONAL must apply directly with them. The Chapter will collect and forward ACPA/NATIONAL annual dues for Fly Ash/Slag Cement companies that elect to join ACPA/NATIONAL through the Chapter.
3. Annual dues are payable at the beginning of each year and are prorated on a quarterly basis. Companies joining the Chapter in December, and paying base dues in full, will have those dues applied to the following year, but their membership will begin immediately (i.e. dues will not be prorated for the 4th quarter).
4. Assessments are due no later than in the quarter following the quarter in which material is sold. Assessments are based on any cementitious tons sold for use in the highway, tollway, airport, and street & local road markets and are as follows:

<i>CEMENTITIOUS MATERIAL:</i> cementitious material sold in Pennsylvania for use in any market to support governmental affairs & other wide-reaching efforts	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Please consider a <i>voluntary</i> \$0.01/ton contribution on all cementitious material sold in all markets in Pennsylvania

5. Tonnage on any project consuming less than 3,000 tons of cementitious material are not assessable. The assessment rate on tons sold to a ready-mixed producer/supplier on projects consuming 3,000 tons or more are as shown above.
6. New members will not be assessed on any tonnage sold for use on projects awarded to contractors more than six-month prior to joining the Chapter. If extraordinary assistance is deemed necessary and appropriate on project not being assessed, an hourly fee for such assistance will be \$100 per hour after the first twelve hours of service.
7. Assessments for new slag cement and fly-ash members will be capped at 12,000 tons/project for the first four quarters of membership, and at 24,000 tons/project for the fifth through eighth quarters of membership.
8. Tons sold after July 1, 2016 on projects awarded to contractors between January 1, 2016 and June 30, 2016 are assessable up to the dollar amount matching that for which the contractor has been assessed on the same project. Please consider making a voluntary contribution on tons sold after July 1, 2016 for projects awarded to contractors in prior years.
9. Assessments on tons sold for projects awarded to contractors after July 1, 2016 are capped at 36,000 tons/project.
